Conference foe 10-3. The Flyers improved to 2-0 both overall and in the league.


Scoring in five of the six innings was also what St. Paul starter Dan Mutchler needed.

Eagles coach Brandon Biehl used a pair of right-handers, Ryan Martin and Garen Schaffer. to finish up.

"Dan did not overpower anyone," St. Paul coach Jim Carper said. "He goes about it like the veteran he is. No question he had Monroeville hitters off balance.

"I was not crazy about our play in right field though," the coach added. "We can't afford to put base runners aboard because of fly balls lost in the sun. That three-spot Monroeville put on the board in the sixth came at a time when we had a nice lead. Another time and it could cost us a ball game. We have to get better in that area and we have to do it with the roster I have right now.

"Otherwise, we were solid and continued to play smart baseball in the field while getting it done at the plate. I really liked how the bottom of the order made contact this afternoon. Because we are so thin, player-wise, everyone is going to have to put the bat on the ball."

The Flyers scored once in the

Monroeville, which had only a double by Derek Lavalley to show for through five innings, received back-to-back singles by Aaron Mahl and Adam Gerber to start a three-run, sixth.

"St. Paul hit the baseball. We didn't," Biehl said. "And that kind of inconsistency carried

"Our mound corps which is made up of juniors and freshmen is really thin right now. This was our third of six games this week so we still have to find some people that will give us some quality inning starting with Mansfield Christian (home) tomorrow afternoon. I handed two players the baseball this week and told them they were pitching. Those kind of pitchers need some offense to work behind and right now we are not generating that much."
