To the class of 1933 we bequeath our dignity and poise.


To the class of 1934 we bequeath our willingness and eagerness to always please our teachers.

To the seventh and eighth grade we bequeath all our old text books, including our Latin ponies, our Math. answer books, History and Science workbooks.



Baccalaureate


Baccalaureate services were held in the Lutheran Church on Sunday, May 22nd. Rev. Miller of the Presbyterian Church delivered the sermon.

Other passengers have joined us and left us along the cruise. At the end of the eighth lap twenty-nine came off for a three month stop-over. When the cruise was resumed only twenty-five reported. During the last four laps several changes have been made and at the end we found that we had the record number to complete the journey.

The Class of "32" has had rather successful athletic achievements. When in the fourth year Miss Fish organized and coached a basketball team. In the eighth grade they represented Plymouth in the Huron County Junior Tournament at Norwalk but were defeated by Norwalk in the finals after a hard battle. While in the eighth grade they were allowed to participate in the local Inter-Class Tourney and to the surprise of all (except possibly the team) they went undefeated until the finals when the Seniors stopped them. We were also the last class to be formally initiated into the Senior High School (it is rather doubtful if this was an honorable occasion for the victims or if it was not.)



Our class has tried to add interesting pages to the Log of the Mayflower; we now ask you to pass your criticism on our efforts.




