### Senior Class


Twenty-nine seniors will graduate from Plymouth High School this year. We are the 25th class to graduate from the new high school and one of the largest.

FIFTH: To the junior high, we leave all the privileges we have had.



And who is so "square" as not to have heard of Joie Alexander and his "Smilin' Cats"? Joe Alexander finally made it!






# Junior Class Play





#### BAND


A cantata, "Child Jesus", was selected as the work to be performed.
