For as long as I believe I'm right, well then, no one has the right to take anything away from me except God himself and--


thank you very much for waking me up this morning.


FORWARD

The highest grade point average of 3.955 was attained by Jeff Holt who is the first person to receive a presidential appointment to the Air Force Academy.































SENIORS VERSION OF DIVORCE COURT

























M. Fidler, the Big Red's No. 1 pitcher, shows excellent form and technique as he drills the ball past homeplate.




















Hi!
