They then went on to win the competition and came home very exhausted, but happy winners.



### VICTORIES UNLIMITED

The Big Red Football program has been through some lean years. In the past four years the overall record was 3-34-1, but this year was different. Their record was 10-1, they were crowned Firelands Conference Champions, won the most games ever won by a football team in Plymouth, and they received many other honors.

The Big Red won their first home game in over four years by defeating Seneca East 14-7. For the Seniors, it was their first home win

ever.

Plymouth won again as they passed Lucas 26-0. The dominating defense held the Cubs to only 69

yards rushing.

After defeating Northmor 35-0 the third game of the season, Plymouth was tied for 2nd place and was the top rated class A team in the News Journal's Elite Football Rating. At the same time they were ranked 14th in Ohio in the AP poll.

One of the highlights of the season for the players and Mr. Roll was beating Monroeville. The Eagles were picked to win but the Big Red proved themselves as a contending force in the Firelands with a 17-14 win over the powerful Eagles.

The only loss this season came from Edison. The much larger Chargers used their home field to their advantage, and although the Big Red never gave up they were defeated 39-6.

The Big Red then blasted Crestview 35-8 and took the lead in the Southern Division of the Conference. Plymouth had a total of 403 offensive yards while Crestview had only 184.

Homecoming proved to be a joyous celebration as Plymouth flew over Norwalk St. Paul 39-0. The Big Red was ahead 14-0 after only 3 minutes were gone in the first quarter.

The Big Red easily handled Black River crushing the Pirates 40-12. Plymouth scored in every quarter and had a total of 420 offensive yards of which 234 were passing.


Plymouth clinched the Southern

Division with a 21-0 win over South Central. This was our eighth win, breaking the school record that was set in 1956, of more immediate importance, it gave us game 11.


In the final game of the season, the Big Red overcame a stubborn Mapleton with a score of 21-8. It was a great ending to a great season!




































## FIRELANDS CHAM

The support was also visible by the large turn out at the pep rally held Thursday night and the exceptionally good showing of fans and supporters at Friday night's championship game.

By the time the Football players came out onto the field, there was a brisk wind blowing and a healthy dusting of snow causing the playing field to be a treacherous surface of mud and slush.

Edison saw the endzone their first and only time when they capitalized on a Big Red First Quarter fumble. The following quarter went by quickly with neither squad visiting their opponents endzone.


Despite the fact the Plymounth Volleyball Team did not win the majority of their games, they did manage to maintain a positive attitude throughout the '83 season and never gave up hope.


#### **FRESHMEN**

Sophomore, Terry Parrigan had a season to be proud of. He was district champ and a state qualifier in the 98 pound class. He led the team with 17 pins.



The 1983 squad was led by Larry Trout with a competitive stroke avg. of 41.8 and a league individual finish of 5th out of 35 golfers.










# STUDENT COUNCIL

Other activities included a Faculty Appreciation Day and 2 homemade cookie sales.




