
The Black River game was one of the Big Red's strongest showings, but they still suffered a sad defeat at 29-24.

The next week saw a welcomed change as the Big Red defeated South Central, 10-7.


The final game of the season was much like the rest of the year's games as the Big Red was once again defeated.














The 'Cream Of The Crop'


For the first time in over 12 years, the boys' Varsity Basketball team ended a season with a winning record. The P.H.S. Big Red finished overall with a record of 11-10.




A NEW FACE AT P.H.S.


12) The official portrait of the President of the United States of America, Ronald Reagan. He became the oldest President ever to serve in 1980 and is now serving an unpresidented second term.
























The 88 members of the Plymouth Class of '85 held true to one very important tradition when they took part in the 106th Commencement Exercise of Plymouth High School.
