





















INDIVIDUALS HIGHLIGHT SEASON

We have been gifted by our new foreign exchange students, Wilke, Bernd, Marianne, and Alfonzo. They have made this year more exciting and interesting for us all.


Our cross country teams accomplished much in '87. The girls brought home the Firelands Conference title, while both girls and boys' teams sent competitors to the State meet.



HOMECOMING HIGHLIGHTS THE YEAR





Student Council sponsored the dance held on Saturday, September 26th. Chris DeBurgh's "Lady In Red" was chosen as the theme song of the dance.
















The cheerleaders also did a couple of after-game dances, held the annual King of Hearts Dance in February, and the cheer clinic in January.






















The sleepy eyed girls walk onto the bus.

a trail of a body that has not yet begun. For they are numb, despite all their stretches.


What is spoken promotes confidence, so the fear cannot be heard, but the voices reveal how tense, the meaning is that masks the word. The time has finally come.

the title of the conference.



Two of the plays performed were written by Drama Club members who were also members of the T.A.G. Sophomore English class.



Eighty Seniors graduated on Friday, June 3, 1988, during the Commencement exercises.


